Ruth Lindsay, SWBL President 2024

Wow, what a year from the start. As we geared up for what is normally our biggest source of new players Mardi Gras Fair Day was cancelled a week out.

Despite not having a public recruitment space, we still managed to get over 50 new people to the open day and over 50 returning players to hone their skills.

We ended up with more players wanting to play than we could take, so we had to cap the number and start a waitlist. What a problem to have.



SWBL had 83% of players return in 2024 which is a fantastic retention rate of current players and 48 new members. Clearly, the word's out that we are the place to be.

These new players stepped right up. They played in all positions, from pitching full games to catching full games throughout the finals series. Out of the 9 teams, 7 had rookies who came in the top 3 of MVP points for their team, and rookies in 4 teams came on top of the MVP points for their teams. What an effort. We thank you all for being integral parts of your teams and SWBL.

For the second year in a row we welcomed a new team the Mittildas, who had a great year of baseball. Thanks to Shae, Ash, Craig and Pip for leading this new team.

What a year of baseball we had. We had a resurfaced ground and facilities and lucky we did as there was a lot of rain and we only had 2 games washed out (other baseball leagues lost half of theirs). And what a difference did the storage sheds make I know my boot wasn't full all season with a kit bag. Thanks to everyone who helped get the gear in and out each week.

We had wonderful displays of sportspersonship, with many teams helping their opposition with pitching and catching advice while the games were going on. It's fantastic to see the members helping each other, no matter how long they have been in the league or what team they are on. This is what makes SWBL so unique and such an amazing supportive community.

We started Friday night training, and I turned up nervously to the first one wondering if anyone would show not knowing if it was going to be a success or flop. Thank goodness it was a success. The Cubs and Mittildas turned up in force every fortnight as well as players from every team. While walking around the diamond on a Sunday some Angels were heard saying "the fielding skills have improved so much this year". SWBL owe a big thanks to Allen and Brad who gave up their Friday nights to help improve the skills of our members.

All 9 teams showed improved skill levels and had some fantastic games on the diamond...here's my point of view as my first year as president.

The Saints, with half of the team being new players and Heather stepping up to take on the coaching role and what an amazing effort in what was also a rebuilding year for them and some close games that could have gone either way. Back in November 2023 we started working on a grant from the NSW Office of Sport to replace a lot of our equipment. Just as the season was about to start, we received the fantastic news that we had been awarded \$7400. I would like to thank Kellie from the Angels who worked tirelessly on this, and we wouldn't have got this grant without her.

We had an amazing launch day attended by members of council and state parliament.

SWBL was also tabled in parliament by a speech from Jo Haylen and Jo attended our Rookie v Lifers game and is very supportive of our future.

I had a lot of feedback about what as members of SWBL you wanted to see happen. Hence I made the committees motto this year "to give back" to our community. At the beginning of the year we made the decision not to make any money to put it all back into our members. Poor Spike the amount of receipts you had to deal with from me was huge.

We could only do this thanks to the previous committee. In 2020 we only had \$17870 in assets and cash and the end of LY we had over \$60k in the bank. This years committee could only do what we did thanks to Holly, Jacqui, Collie and Jasper and our grants, you made me feel like Santa, Ellen or Oprah, not sure which one.

A huge gratitude of thanks to our major sponsor The Golden Barley Hotel where we gather every Sunday night, not only do they give us a financial payment they also allow us to do the meat raffles every Sunday night which is a big earner for us.

We received \$2000 from ACON this went towards us getting a new you beaut camera for all those fantastic social media photos. It was also great to have them do the first pitch in the rookies v lifers game.

We had a committee of 16 brilliant individuals and I would like to thank each and everyone of them. A lot of hard work and hours go into making SWBL what it is.

Charlie did a fantastic job on events bringing us all together on many fun occasions. We started with the Mardi Gras viewing and after party in conjunction with Sydney Queer Irish and what a great success it was giving people a safe fun environment to watch the parade and party afterwards. Rainbow Diamond Nights with the Lip Sync was a super fun night, congratulations to the Angels for taking the win home and to all teams, you could see by the performances a lot of work was put in to make it an amazing night. A big thanks to Lesbians Incorporated who gave us a \$2000 grant to help us put on this night and keep the tickets to a very low \$20. As well as other social events.

I'm sure you will all agree that our social media was taken to the next level. The team of Jess, Elle and Renee kept the socials coming and informed us all of what was happening on and off the diamond.

Kylie and Janna on grounds and equipment and an extra bonus with Janna and the coffee van.

We had our bellies filled every week at the BBQ with Jojo and Co doing all the shopping.

Kellie did all our grants work netting us a total of \$11400 in cash to help us play and party. Plus already another \$10k for 2025 & 2026 to train our coaches and umpires.

And our general members who chipped in with all sorts of jobs and were putting their hands up to help with whatever they could, Naomi, Jude and Holly.

On the SWBL executive committee this year we had 3 new people out of 4 and I would personally like to thank Laura, Lisa and Spike. The support and back up they gave me was first class. They were far from "yes" people and challenged me on anything they had a different opinion on which I have huge respect for and this gave the best results for all of SWBL. We worked as a great team to get everything done

Finally a heartfelt thanks to all the coaches and coordinators who keep the teams running smoothly and organised getting people along to team duties. And we wouldn't be playing games without our volunteer umpires who do an amazing job under pressure circumstances.

Last but not least a big thank you to each and every player who makes SWBL what we are.

And on a personal note I would like to thank my partner $Mary\ I$ couldn't of done this without her help and support.

Financial report

Antonella (Spike) Schulte, SWBL Treasurer 2024

2024 has been a massive year for SWBL. Expanding teams, incredible social events and so much support from the community. We started the year with the plan to give back to the league as much as we could, and hopefully we have done just that.

Through the amazing work of our President Ruth and grants queen Kellie, we have received \$17,900 in cash and kind from our fabulous sponsors the Golden Barley Hotel, ACON and RBI as well as incredible grants from the Office of Sport (how's the new equipment?) and the Lesbian Inc (talk about a brilliant mid-season party!).



Speaking of equipment, the Office of Sport grant (with extra cash we pitched in) allowed us to replace all the old equipment that was worn and old so we can continue to ensure the safety of our members. All teams received new catcher's mitts and bats, we replaced team helmets that had no padding left and bought brand new kits for the Mittildas and Lions, plus a range of other equipment for the league to share. All in, we spent \$14,474 on new equipment this year, compared to the combined total for the previous 10 years (2014-2023) of \$16,742.

We have continued to offer some of the lowest fees in community sport and will work with anyone in need to ensure financial hardship is not a barrier to participation.

As mentioned, this year was all about giving back. We started paying our wonderful plate umpire volunteers (plus a free sausage and drink for them and the base umpire), did a double member's draw on grand final night (two Lions won! Who would have guessed?), raised over \$1,900 for charity and put on some wonderful social events, subsidising the cost whenever we could (including this year's AGM tickets). We also hired the ground for an extra night every fortnight to host league wide training, which we hope everyone could attend and enjoy.

All in, a snapshot of our finances for the 2024 SWBL season is as follows:

- Cash and kind received from sponsorship \$8,500
 - Golden Barley increased from \$4,700 to \$6,000
 - RBI provided \$500 to spend on league equipment, plus a discount on league purchases throughout the year
- Cash received from grants \$9,400
- Income from registration fees \$22,981
- Operating cost (income expenses) of BBQ and meat raffle +\$10,019 (compared to +\$9,416 last year)
- New equipment purchased \$14,474
- Umpire payments \$1,300
- Member's draw **\$2,000**
- Raised for and donated to charity \$1,954
- End of year surplus \$13,662
- End of year net assets \$65,713

LGBTQIA+ Inclusivity, Breaking Barriers & Celebrating Diversity On and Off the Diamond: SWBL was thrilled in 2024 to be successful in receiving a NSW Government 'Local Sport Grant' of \$7400. This funding provided our league with much-needed new baseball gear and safety equipment, supporting the growth of our club with high-quality equipment. Thanks to this initiative all teams received requested new gear (and a full kit for the new team). This grant also helps us promote inclusion for women and LGBTQIA+ athletes in our sport. Proudly supported by the NSW Government.





Rainbow Diamond Nights

A Sensational Mid-Season Social for Sydney Women's Baseball League Community. After a successful grant application, SWBL was delighted to receive a generous \$2000 grant from Lesbians Incorporated. This grant, which supports lesbian and lesbian-friendly groups across Australia, helped SWBL host the event and subsidise the cost of tickets. The evening featured a Lip Sync Competition with SWBL teams, guest judges, and a DJ. "Rainbow Diamond Nights" wasn't just a celebration of the sport but also a vital opportunity to foster belonging and inclusivity, creating a safe space for those often marginalised in the community.

Diamond Inclusion

Women & LGBTQIA+ Sydney Women's Baseball League Coaching and Umpiring Clinics. In September 2024, SWBL was awarded a \$5,000 Active Inner West Council Grant for both the 2025 and 2026 seasons, totalling \$10,000. This funding will support the launch of coaching and umpiring clinics aimed at fostering inclusivity within the league. The program, scheduled to begin at the start of each season, will provide valuable training opportunities for women

and LGBTQIA+ participants, promoting skill development and leadership in the sport. The positive impact of these clinics is expected to benefit SWBL and its community throughout the 2025 and 2026 seasons.
